

Social Narrative Museum of Natural History

I will wait until it is my turn to pay for admission to the museum.




There is a picture of a pyramid I can stand in front of if I want the person I came with to take my photo.




I will follow the museum rules and not bring any food or drink into the galleries.


When I go up the ramp into the galleries, I will see a sign directing me to the Egyptian exhibit. I will follow the direction the arrow is pointing.

The exhibit is a safe place for me to see Egyptian mummies and artifacts. I will follow the museum's rules and not tap or bang on the case glass.




There could be many other visitors in the exhibit when I am there but I can take a break if I need to.
